PUPIL PREMIUM - DOES YOUR CHILD QUALIFY?

If your child is eligible for **free school meals**, they may also be entitled to a sum of money paid to school to boost their learning. The pupil premium is a sum of money given to schools each year by the Government to improve the attainment of disadvantaged children.

We spend our money in a variety of ways (take a look at our Pupil Premium Spending on the school website) to help children to make accelerated learning, enrich their school life and support them with their emotional wellbeing. Children qualify for free school meals – and accordingly pupil premium – if you receive any of the following benefits:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less);
- Income support;
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance;
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit;
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less.

These benefits have now been rolled into a single benefit, called Universal Credit.

Since September 2014, all children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 have qualified for free school meals, regardless of their family income, but only the children who would qualify for free meals under the above income-based criteria will receive the pupil premium.

If your child qualifies for free school meals, please come and tell us – even if they take a packed lunch – as this enables them to claim pupil premium status.
