NQT Support

Focused support for newly qualified teachers to ensure that they develop the skills to teach effectively and plan successfully for vulnerable groups

Cost: £1,250

Outcome: The progress/attainment difference between PP pupils and their peers continues to diminish. All NQTs complete their induction year. The Pupil Premium is additional funding for schools to use to support pupils who are disadvantaged, assessed using Free School Meal entitlement information. Parent Link

Our Parent Link works with families and children to provide pastoral care and support, signposting to relevant professionals and support links when necessary.

Cost: £3,200

Family Support
