### Reading (Blending) and Spellings (Segmenting their sounds)

These are suggested games to help with home learning should you wish to do so Begin by reviewing all the sounds learnt so far as flash cards before attempting the following activities:

- Please encourage your child to look at the cards and sound talk each word in order to 'hear' the word. For example, 'i-t, it'. This may take a few weeks to master the skill so don't worry if they cannot do it straight away! A little and often is the best technique.
- Please can you practice saying the following words slowly (without showing the
  cards) for your child to hear the sounds that make up each word. Encourage
  them to sound talk each word before trying to find the sounds. For example, say
  the word 'it' slowly and your child should respond 'it, i-t' and then try to find
  each sound using the cut up letters and arrange them to spell the word.
- If your child is able to write the sounds then they can try to write it but please make sure they use small letters and start their letters in the correct place so that they form them properly.
